

Help me to find my true vocation in life, and grant that through it I may find happiness myself and bring happiness to others.

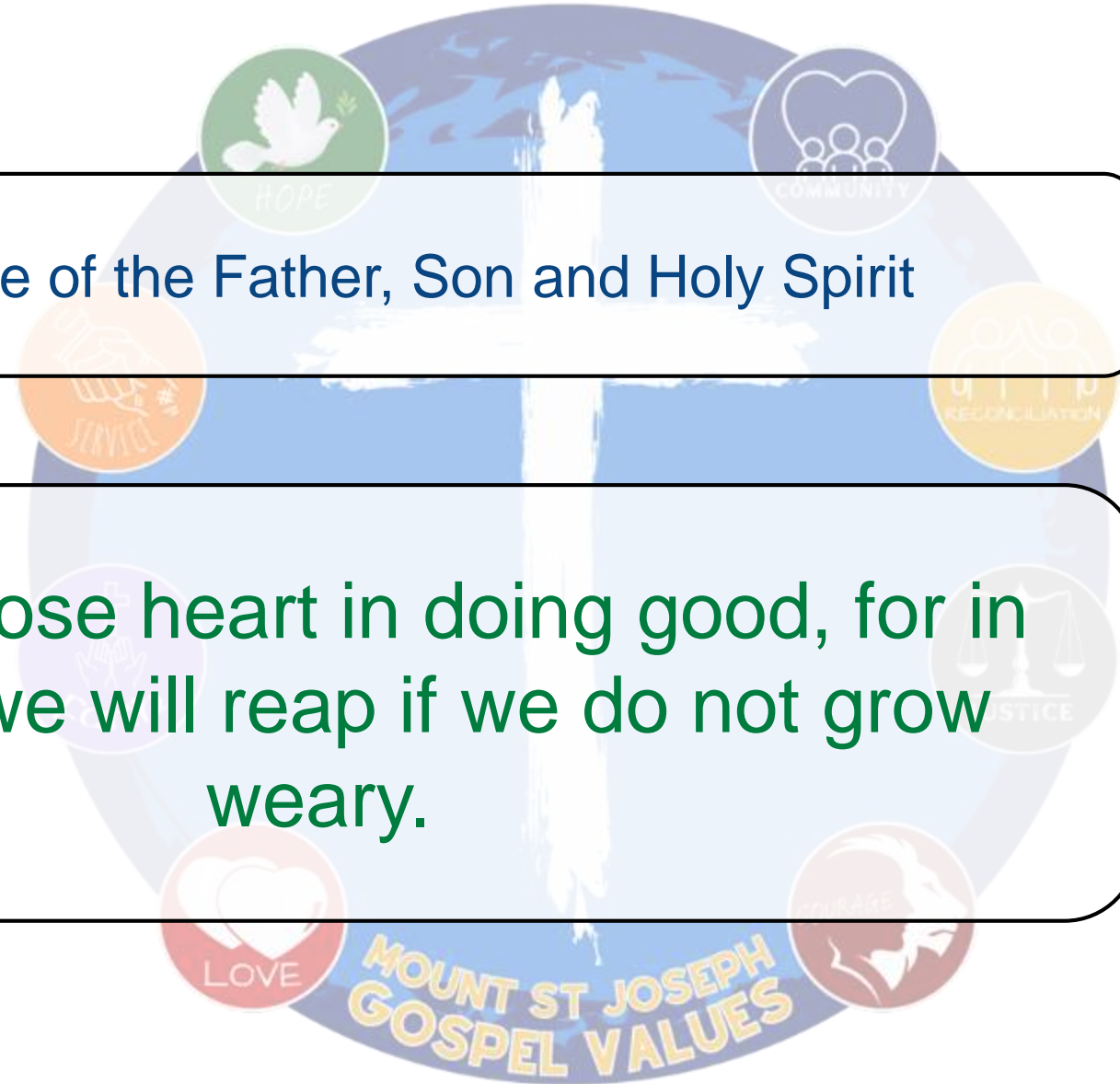

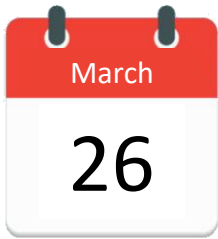

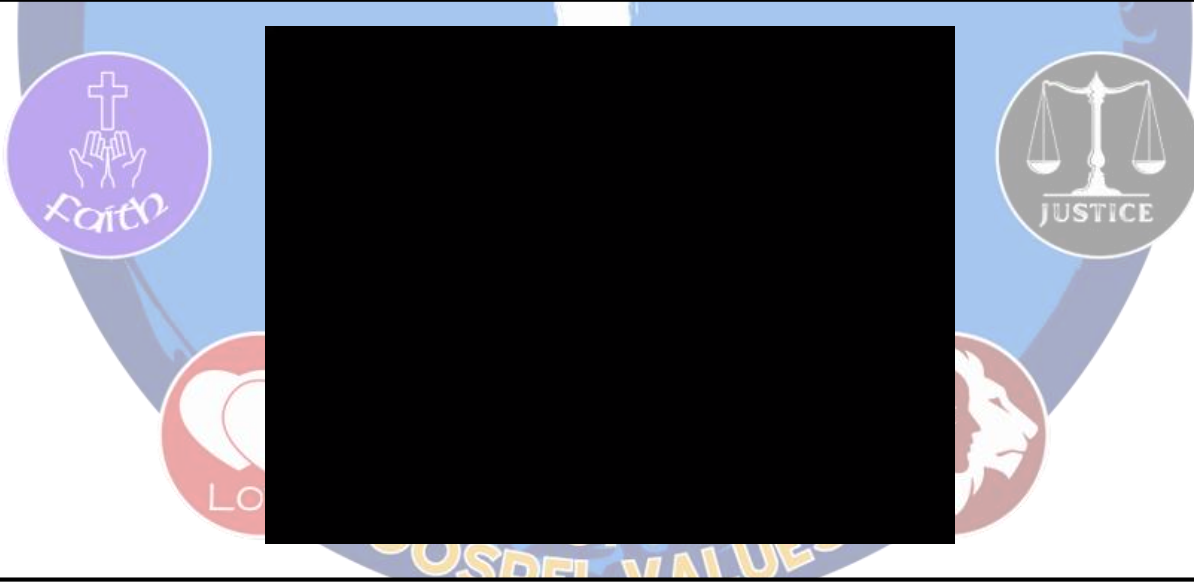

Amen.



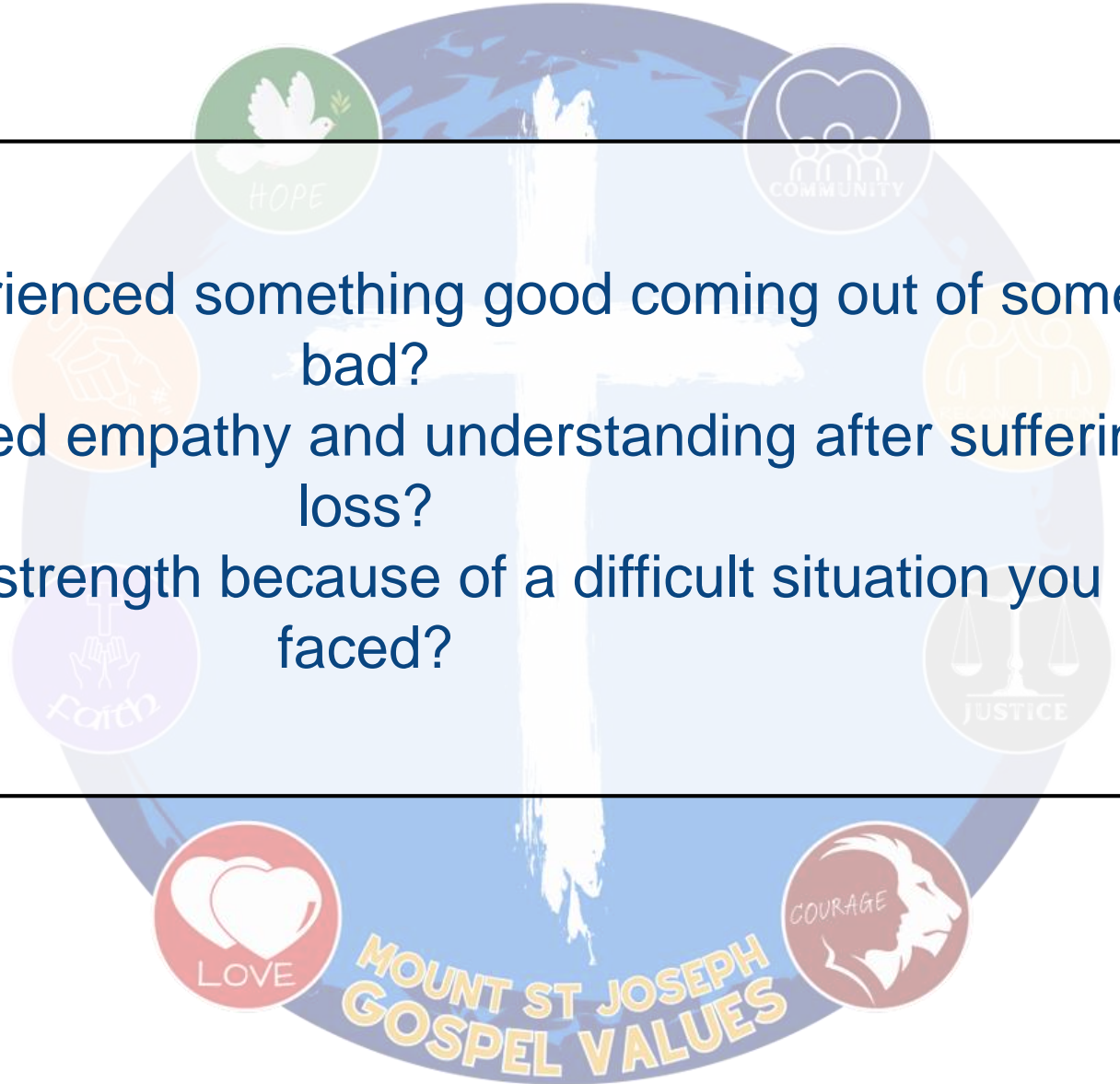

- Have you ever experienced something good coming out of something bad?
- Have you developed empathy and understanding after suffering a loss?
- Have you grown in strength because of a difficult situation you have faced?





There were some present at that very time who told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. And he answered them, ‘Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered in this way? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them: do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others who lived in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish.’

And he told this parable: ‘A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vine dresser, “Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?” And he answered him, “Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig round it and put on manure. Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.”’



It's very easy to judge others, to think about how they worse than anyone else ever has been and dream up the punishments they should have. People have come to Jesus telling him about people who deserve to be punished. Jesus doesn't deny that God will punish people. He even says that unless those talking to him change their ways, they will be punished too.

He does, however, tell a story about God's generosity and reluctance to punish even those of us who aren't living as well as we could be doing.

Jesus likens God to a gardener, or vine dresser. A man wants to cut down a useless fig tree that has not provided any fruit for the past three years. The gardener asks for another chance. If he puts manure round the plant to fertilise it, it may yet grow good fruit.

God is committed to us. God is giving us the opportunity to make a difference and will be there, helping us along the way. Are we committed to providing good fruit for God?
