



In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.' For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said, 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight."

Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, and they were baptised by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?



Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as ourfather", for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up childrenfor Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Everytree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown intothe fire.

'I baptise you with water for repentance, but he who is coming afterme is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He willbaptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in hishand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into thebarn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'



Lord, help us be like John the Baptist—
people who prepare the way for Jesus through kindness,
honesty and courage.

Show us how to clear away what distracts us, so we can welcome you more fully into our lives this Advent.



As we leave today, may we carry Jesus' hope and light into our school and our homes.

May our words be gentle, our actions thoughtful, and our hearts open.

Come, Lord Jesus, and guide us this Advent.
