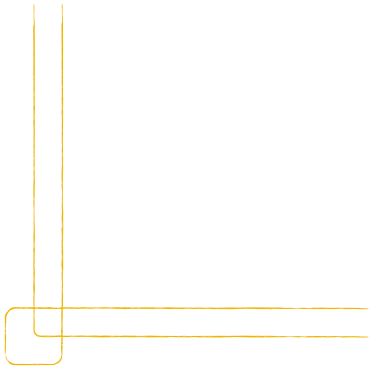

Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again. ^[b] The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.” ¹⁵ The woman said to him, “Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water.”

The Samaritan woman in the Gospel represents anyone who is marginalised. She is a woman, a foreigner and someone who doesn't live as society expects. The Samaritan woman is an outsider – and yet Jesus chooses to spend time with her. This is longest recorded conversation Jesus has with anyone in the Gospels! It is this Samaritan woman who first hears from Jesus that he is the Messiah, the saviour sent to rescue us all.

Water is a physical symbol of a deeper reality. God will pour love into our hearts, filling our lives with meaning and purpose. This living water will help us grow to be the people we are meant to be. As St Augustine said, the emptiness inside us can only be filled by God's love, the living water that Jesus offers.



Nourishing God, You make water spring forth from the rock.
We come to you hot and thirsty.

We praise You for the many ways we are refreshed,
body and soul, by the gift of water.

The rush of running through a sprinkler,
or wading ankle-deep in a mountain stream,
is a delight to the senses!

In Baptism we were immersed in water,
